

HEAD LICE

The head lice are out and about. Please check your child's hair regularly for head lice and eggs (nits) - use

a fine metal **tooth nit comb** and plenty of cheap hair conditioner applied to the dry hair. This is a cheap method to see if your child has head lice, and if they do please treat with an approved head lice treatment. It is very important to remove all the eggs and repeat the process regularly until you no longer find eggs or lice in your comb. Eggs will continue to hatch over a ten day period.

UNCLE MARK'S CULTURAL WALK

4 Ruby really enjoyed their NAIDOC cultural walk with Uncle Mark. Here are a few excerpts from some of their recounts.

"On a glorious Monday, a sweet man called Uncle Mark took a small class on a huge walk through the Urunga boardwalk. He showed us all the bush foods you can eat and what things are medicine and what plants can cure our wounds. The goats morning glory helps soothe your headaches, you put it over a fire until it's heated, and when it's heated you put it on where your headache is."

"The second plant we learnt about was the crighton lily. The crighton lily is white and it heals blue bottle stings and soothes the pain.

My favourite plant that I learnt about is the salted mangroves because you pick a leaf and lick it's underside.

I strongly recommend you going on a bush walk with an aboriginal elder."

"After that we saw the grey mangroves, also known as the salt leaves. You can lick them. We also saw the cobra worm. The cobra worm nibbles on the wood and makes little holes.

Personally my favourite was the grey mangroves because it was so salty and yummy. Urunga Public School is so lucky to have Uncle Mark visit to help us learn about living in the wild.

One quick fact, if you ever come across a big scary kangaroo, don't worry, just put your face near your belly and scrunch up like a ball and slowly crawl away."
