LIBRARY NEWS

2020 is here! A new year and new beginnings for us all.

A warm welcome to all our new students and their families and a big welcome back to our returning students and school community. I look forward to meeting our new Kindergarten students and helping facilitate their enjoyment of reading and our Library.

Borrowing Information

There is a standard <u>2 week borrowing period</u> to allow plenty of time for you and your child to share the books they have selected. Alternatively, they may return them and select new books each week at their scheduled library class, or drop into the library during the lunch break, as well as before and after school.

*K-2 students = $\frac{2 \text{ books}}{2}$ *Years 3-4 = $\frac{3 \text{ books}}{2}$ *Years 5-6 = $\frac{4 \text{ books}}{2}$

Students in <u>K-2 classes will need a library bag</u> to help protect the books they borrow. Students in primary classes 3-6 do not require a library bag.

Weekly Library Classes

Library classes are scheduled from Monday to Wednesday. Every class will attend a library session for an hour each week, where they engage in whole class, small group or individual activities/projects that will have a focus on a Key Learning Area such as Reading and Literature, Visual Literacy, Information Literacy, History and Geography. During their library session there is time set aside to return books and browse the library to make new selections as well as just enjoy some browsing and reading time.

Monday classes: 4 Ruby + K Red + 2/3 Green

Tuesday classes: 1/2 Teal + 5/6Maroon

Wednesday classes: K White + 5/6Violet + 1/2Yellow + 3/4Blue

Book Fairs & Book Club

During the year I usually hold 2 *Book Fairs*. The first Fair is around Mother's Day and is booked in for Term 2, Weeks 2 and 3 from the 4^{th} May $- 6^{th}$ May & from the 11^{th} May $- 13^{th}$ May. The second one is our Christmas Book Fair and is usually held late November/early December.

Book Club – During the year your child will bring a <u>Scholastic Book Club</u> brochure home. There is always quite a range of books and speciality items available for purchase. If you wish to make a purchase you can fill out the form at the back of the brochure and send it and appropriate monies in an envelope to school; or you can order online via the parent loop. Even if you don't purchase any books, it is my experience that your child will thoroughly enjoy having a look through them and showing you what they like.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION Busways

Did you know that by law you must slow down to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing?

As our students start the 2020 school year, the NSW Government and your local school bus operator Busways is reminding parents, teachers and other motorists about this law which is designed to keep our kids safe.

Lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors open, and they keep flashing for 20 seconds after the doors close. Children are most at risk in the minutes after they get off the bus as the can be unpredictable in their movements.

Fines and demerit points apply if a motorist is caught going over 40km/hr when passing a bus with flashing lights.

Motorists can help reduce the risk of an incident and keep children safe by:

- Slowing down to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing,
- Looking out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in <u>school zones</u> or along bus routes, and
- Giving way to buses when they merge back into traffic.
