TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEYS

We have registered to participate in the Tell Them From Me survey again this year. Our students from Years 4 to 6 are invited to complete the survey twice during the year.

We also ask that all parents from Kindergarten to Year 6 complete the survey also. It is called the Partners in Learning. The anonymous information gathered by us from these surveys helps us to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parent and school. Our wonderful team of teachers also complete the survey each year.

Thank you to those parents and carers who have already completed the survey. A link for the anonymous parent Partners in Learning survey was sent via SMS to you last week. Please let us know if you didn't receive a link to complete the survey. The survey window closes on Friday 23rd October.

UPDATED GUIDELINES FOR OPERATIONS DURING COVID-19

Guidelines for schools were updated recently. Following is a list of changes in guidelines as they will impact on us at Urunga Public School until further notice:

School attendance:

Students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition and the expected timeframe
- > they are currently unwell.

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms. Schools will make arrangements for students who present as unwell or have flu like symptoms to be sent home.

NSW Health have requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the <u>COVID-19 clinics</u>.

Students and staff with flu like symptoms will **need to provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result before being permitted to return to school.**

Schools are not required to conduct widespread temperature screening or mandate the wearing of a mask.

All schools will be vigilant when implementing infection control, physical distancing and personal hygiene protocols to protect the health and safety of students and staff. Schools will promote the need to follow good hygiene practices such as:

- regularly washing hands
- > avoiding sharing drinks or food
- > coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- > filling water bottles from bubblers rather than using the bubbler directly.








'PIRATE DAY'

HEAD LICE

The head lice are out and about. Please check your child's hair regularly for head lice and eggs (nits) - use a fine metal **tooth nit comb** and plenty of cheap hair conditioner applied to the dry hair. This is a cheap method to see if your child has head lice, and if they do please treat with an approved head lice treatment. It is very important to remove all the eggs and repeat the process regularly until you no longer find eggs or lice in your comb. Eggs will continue to hatch over a ten day period.

STEM (SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING AND MATHEMATICS)

STEM this term has focused on technology and engineering. Students have explored programming and electrical circuits with Makey-Makey and Scratch where they have navigated mazes, and designed digital musical instruments.

The engineering concept of STEM activities helps to promote problem-solving and innovative thinking. Students have applied various scientific principles to learn the strongest shapes for building and how to apply them to solve various challenges. Students have used these concepts. combined with the scientific method, to build bridges out of paper straws and play-dough, newspaper forts, and recreate models of famous landmarks using spaghetti and marshmallows.

As the term has progressed, students have shown great ability to think outside the box and work in teams to solve challenges. It has been a wonderful term of laughter and exploration.
